## INSTRUCTIONS

For 2 or More Players

## Object

Press Croc's loose teeth back into place, and be the only player not to get "chomped"!

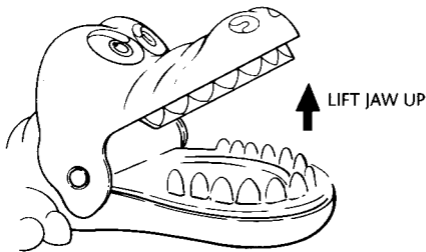
## Contents

1 Cute Plastic Crocodile

# Game Setup

1. Place Croc on a flat, level surface. A table top is fine. Even the carpet will do!
2. Start with Croc's mouth in the fully closed position.
3. Now, lift up Croc's jaw all the way until it locks into place. See Figure 1.

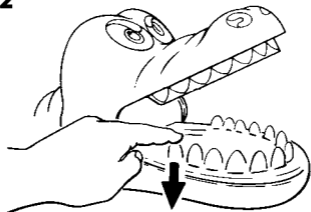
# How To Play

The youngest player starts the game. Play then continues clockwise.

## SAVE A LOOSE TOOTH!

On your turn, pick a tooth — ANY tooth! Then, using your index (pointer) finger, press down firmly on the loose tooth until it snaps into place. **IMPORTANT!** The first tooth that you touch is the tooth you must press down! See Figure 2. **NOTE:** Do not hold onto Croc with your other hand while you are pressing down on the tooth.

Press tooth down all the way.

- If Croc “sits still” after you press down the tooth, you’re safe! This ends your turn. Now it’s the next player’s turn to save a loose tooth!
- If Croc snaps his jaws, you got chomped!

## **GETTING CHOMPED!**

If you get chomped, you're out of the game! If more than one player remains, the game continues — so stick around!

The remaining players follow all of the steps under Game Setup. Play then continues as described above, beginning with the player to the left of the last chomped player.

## **How To Win**

Keep playing until only one player is left. That player wins the game!

## **SAVE CROC FROM A TIRED MOUTH!**

Always make sure that Croc's mouth is closed when you are done playing. To do this, press down on Croc's teeth (one at a time) until he snaps his jaws shut.
